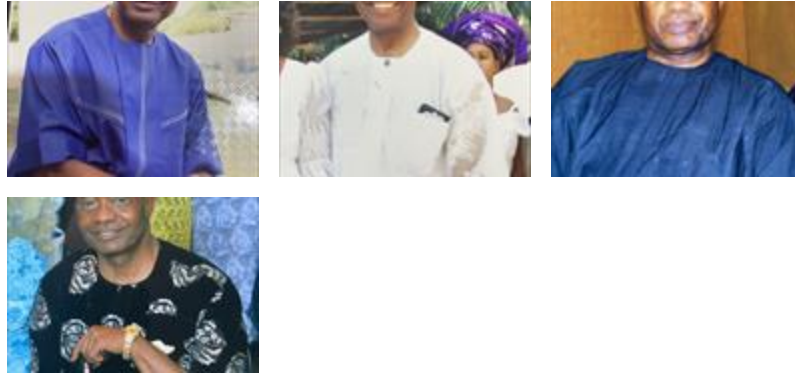

Ifendu Nnana Okpan was a happy man and enthusiastically assisted others whenever the opportunity presented itself. He had a humble heart and avoided conflict and would rather allow things to play out, no matter the pressure, and for as long as it takes. 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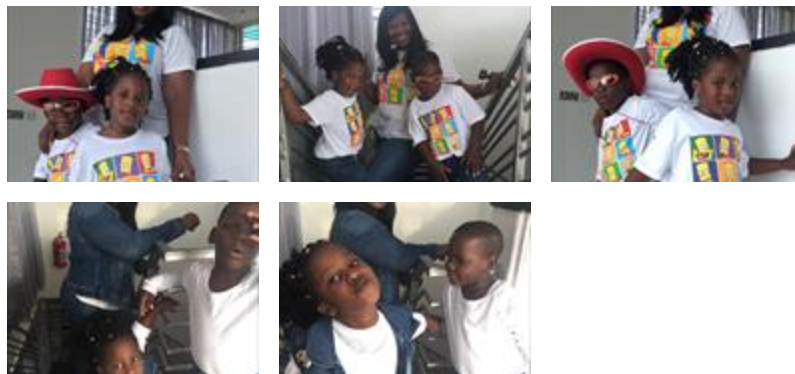
